This brochure will help you learn more about ATTR-CM and VYNDAMAX. VYNDAMAX is a treatment taken once a day, every day.

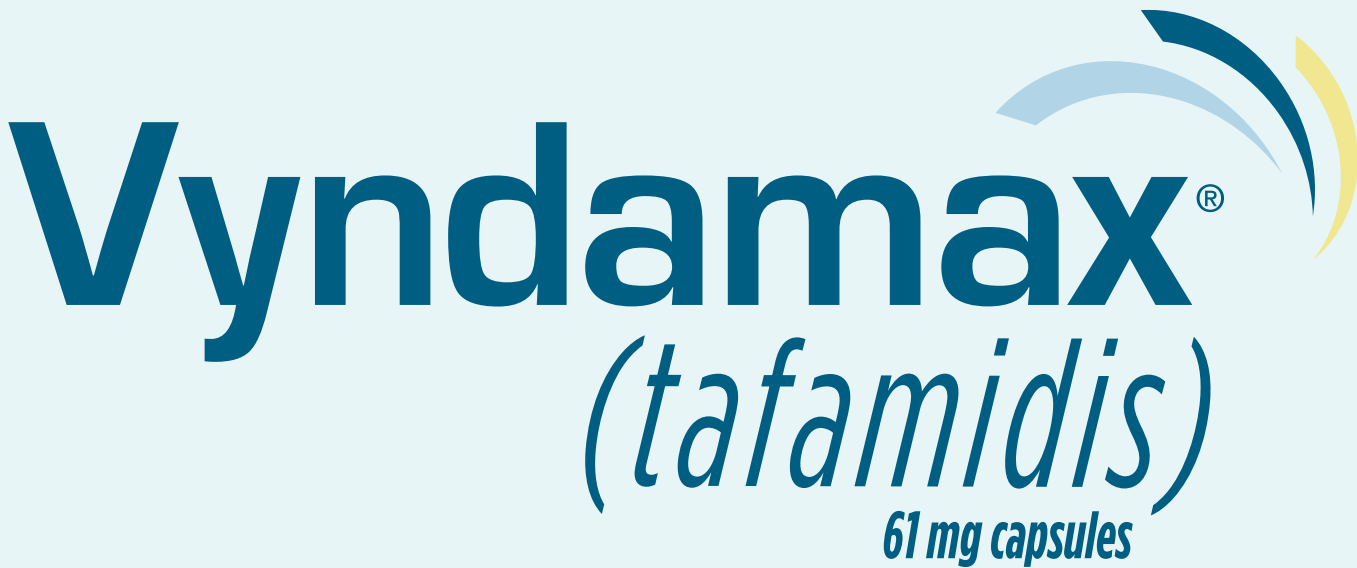

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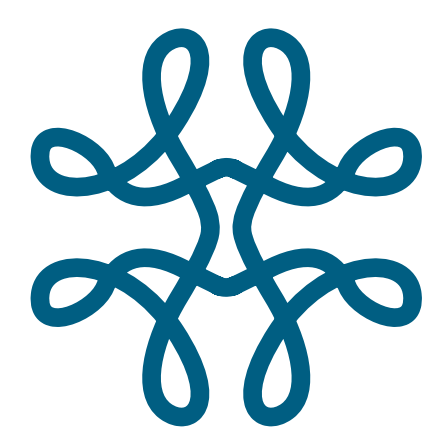
ATTR-CM, or transthyretin cardiac amyloidosis, is a rare and serious condition that affects the heart

ATTR-CM is a type of amyloidosis. That means it is a condition caused by proteins in the body that change shape or fold incorrectly. When these proteins don't work correctly, they can build up in different parts of the body. When they build up in the heart, it can cause ATTR-CM.

There are 2 types of ATTR-CM:

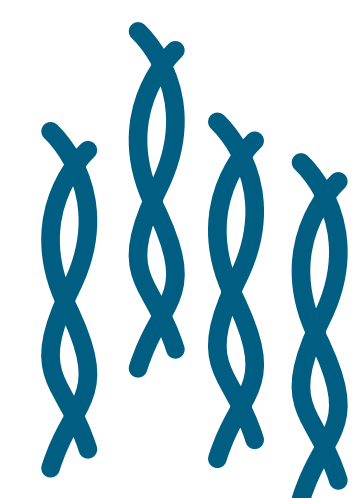
- Wild-type can happen due to aging.
- Hereditary happens because of genes you inherit.

How ATTR-CM affects your heart



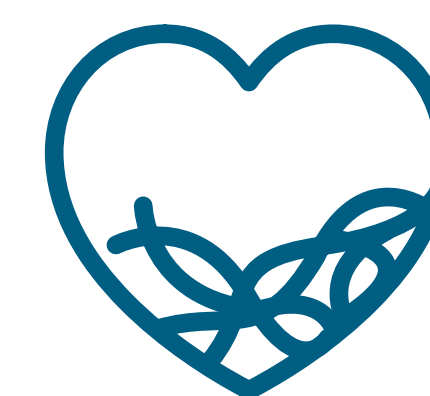

Your liver produces **transthyretin (TTR)**. TTR is a protein that carries a hormone and vitamin A throughout the bloodstream.

When you have ATTR-CM, the TTR protein becomes **unstable and misfolds**.

Over time, the misfolded proteins **build up in the heart**. This can cause the muscles in the heart to get thick and stiff, which can lead to heart failure.

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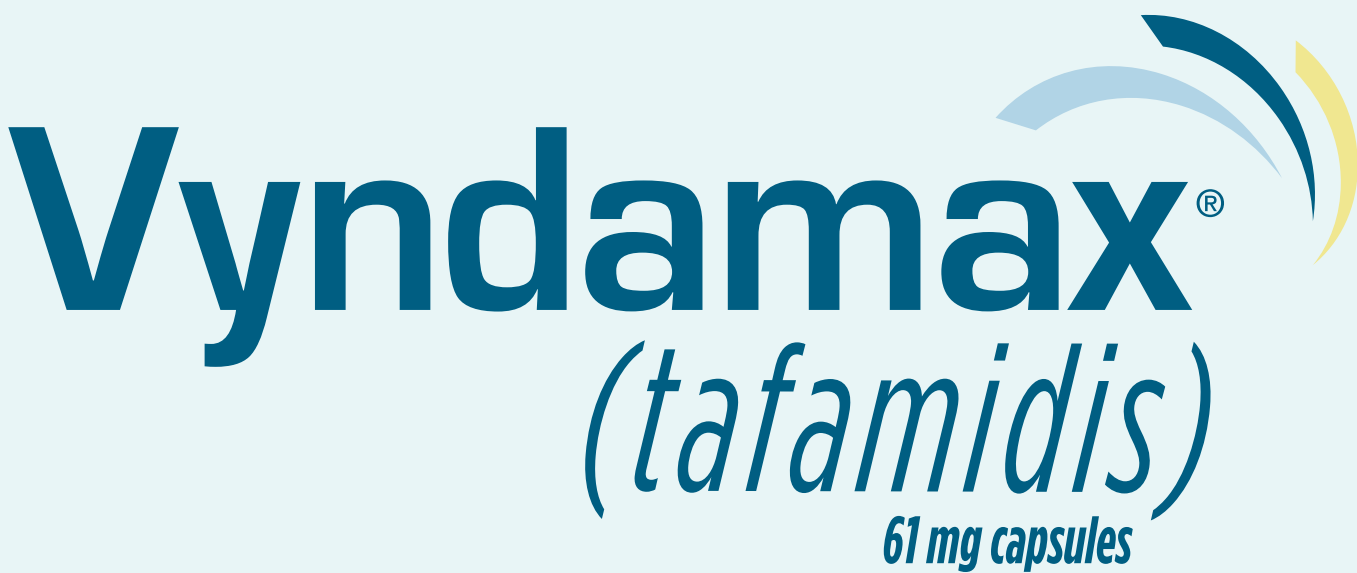
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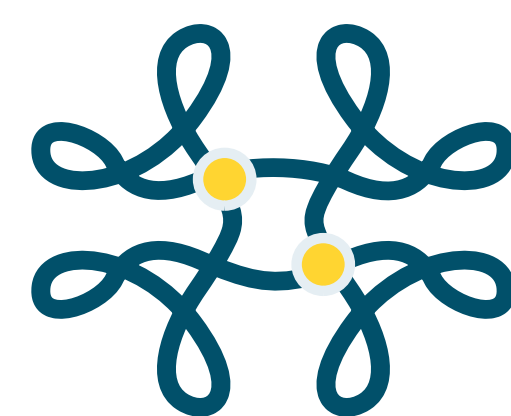

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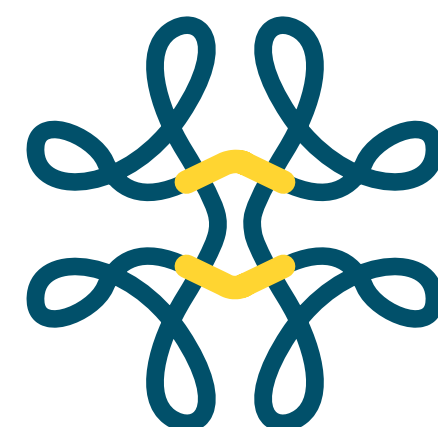

Here’s how VYNDAMAX works inside your body:



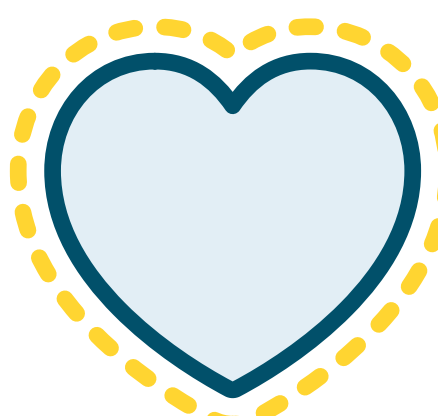
Attach

VYNDAMAX attaches to the TTR protein.



Stabilize

VYNDAMAX stabilizes TTR, helping it stay together.



Maintain

By stabilizing TTR, VYNDAMAX can help slow the progression of ATTR-CM.

VYNDAMAX WORKS BY BINDING TO THE TTR PROTEIN, STABILIZING IT AND PREVENTING IT FROM BREAKING DOWN.

In a laboratory study, VYNDAMAX® (tafamidis) stabilized more than 90% of the TTR protein at the approved dose. This study was not designed to predict or measure clinical outcomes.

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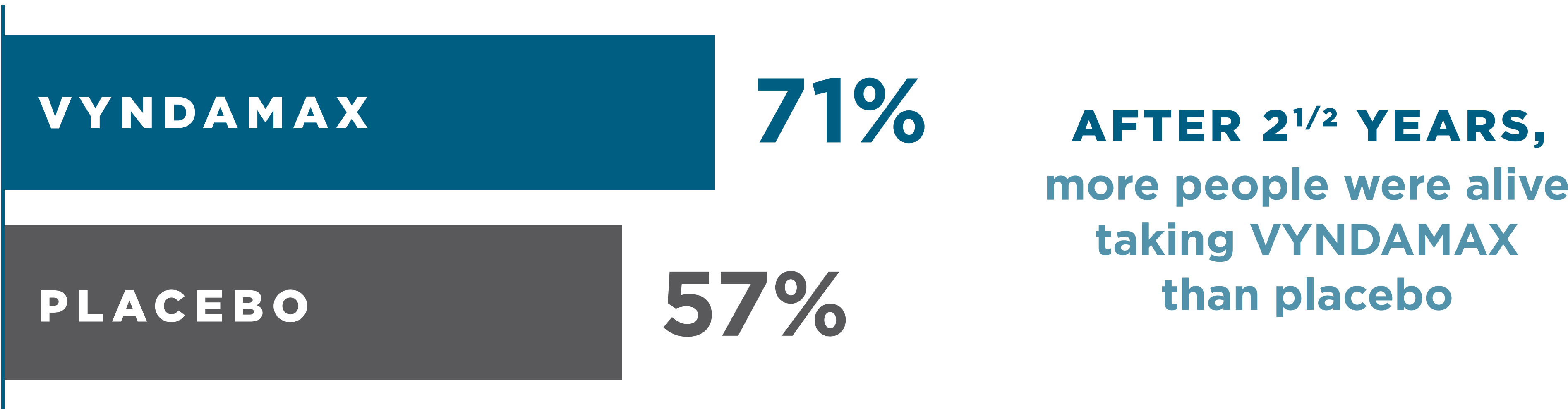
VYNDAMAX can help patients live longer

VYNDAMAX* was studied in the Tafamidis in Transthyretin Amyloidosis Cardiomyopathy Clinical Trial (known as ATTR-ACT).

The study tested if VYNDAMAX could help people with ATTR-CM live longer and reduce hospitalizations due to heart problems compared to placebo. The study also tested the impact of VYNDAMAX on quality of life and ability to function.

In the ATTR-ACT study, patients taking VYNDAMAX lived longer than those taking placebo.

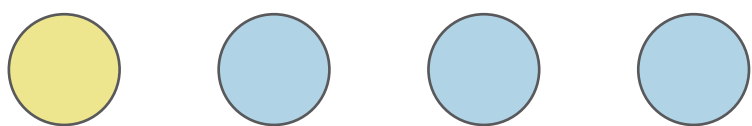
Survival rate at 30 months



VYNDAMAX works to help slow down the disease. Even though you may not feel an effect on your symptoms, it's important to keep taking VYNDAMAX as prescribed.

*The clinical studies of VYNDAQEL[®] (tafamidis meglumine) supported the approval of VYNDAMAX[®] (tafamidis), which contains the same active ingredient.

What is VYNDAMAX?



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VYNDAMAX can help lower the risk of hospitalizations related to heart problems

In the study, patients taking VYNDAMAX had fewer heart-related hospitalizations than those in the placebo group.

CARDIOLOGIST RECOMMENDED

VYNDAMAX is a treatment with a Class 1* recommendation for ATTR-CM in guidelines from the American College of Cardiology, American Heart Association, and the Heart Failure Society of America.

*Class 1 guidelines are given when there’s strong evidence or general agreement that a treatment is beneficial, useful, and effective. The above recommendation is from the 2022 guidelines.



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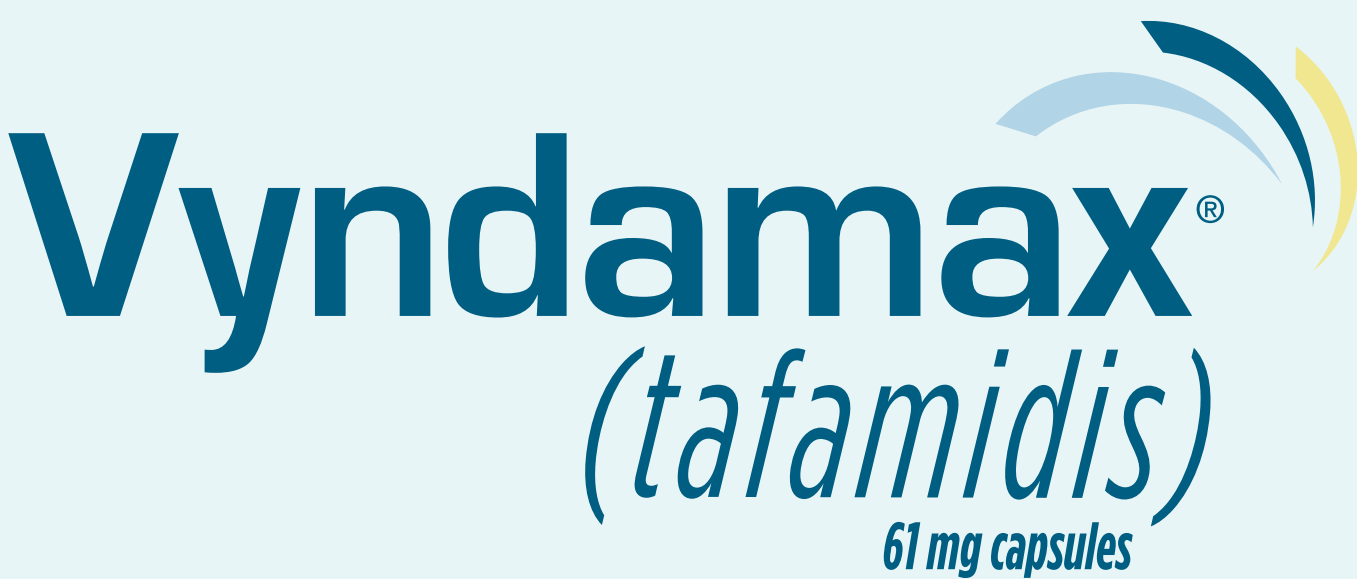
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VYNDAMAX can help slow a decline in quality of life

In the ATTR-ACT study at 30 months, **people taking VYNDAMAX saw a slower decline in their quality of life compared to people taking placebo.** The measure of quality of life included physical abilities and social activities. This effect was noticed in as little as 6 months, and lasted throughout the study.*

The study used a 23-question survey called the Kansas City Cardiomyopathy Questionnaire (KCCQ), which includes questions about mental health, shortness of breath, fatigue, swollen feet or ankles, and ability to do social and physical activities.

*Patients in the VYNDAMAX and placebo groups had worse KCCQ overall summary scores at month 30 than at the start of the study.

At the end of the 30-month clinical trial, compared to people not on treatment (placebo group), people taking VYNDAMAX reported:

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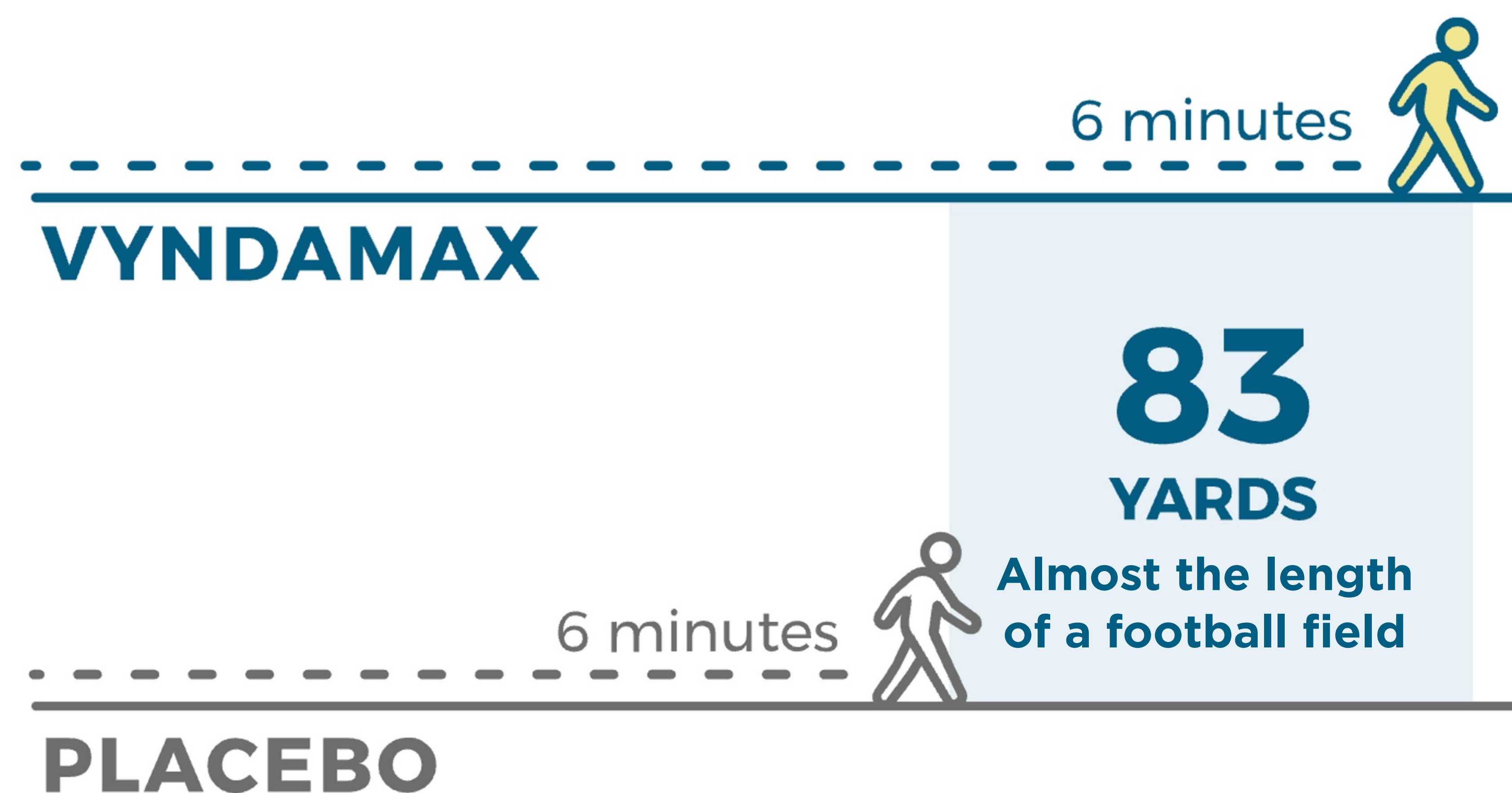
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VYNDAMAX showed a positive result in the 6-minute walk test

The **6-minute walk test** measures heart function and exercise capacity.



At 30 months, patients taking VYNDAMAX were able to walk 83 yards farther than patients not taking VYNDAMAX (placebo).*

*Patients in the VYNDAMAX and placebo groups had worse 6-minute walking distance than at the start of the study.



**How do I take
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VYNDAMAX is the first and only once-a-day, single capsule for ATTR-CM



VYNDAMAX offers convenient **once-a-day dosing***

- A single 61-mg, once-daily capsule
- Taken by mouth
- VYNDAMAX requires no additional lab testing or monitoring

Even if you don't feel VYNDAMAX working, keep taking it as prescribed.

ATTR-CM is a condition that worsens overtime, and VYNDAMAX can help slow its progression.

Managing heart health is more than just your ATTR-CM treatment. Your healthcare provider will be able to monitor your heart and suggest a holistic approach to your care should your symptoms worsen. Keeping an open line of communication with your healthcare provider helps you make informed decisions together about managing your heart health.

VYNDAMAX capsules should be swallowed whole and never crushed or cut. If you miss a dose, take it as soon as you remember. If it is time for your next dose, skip the missed dose and take the next dose at your regularly scheduled time. Do not take 2 doses at the same time.

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*The recommended dosage is either VYNDAMAX 61 mg (one 61-mg tafamidis capsule) or VYNDAQEL 80 mg (four 20-mg tafamidis meglumine capsules) taken by mouth once a day.

Doctor prescribes VYNDAMAX

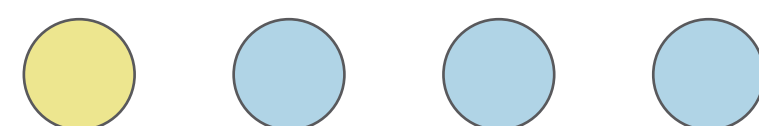
Your doctor will send your VYNDAMAX prescription to a specialty pharmacy. A specialty pharmacy ships medication right to your home.

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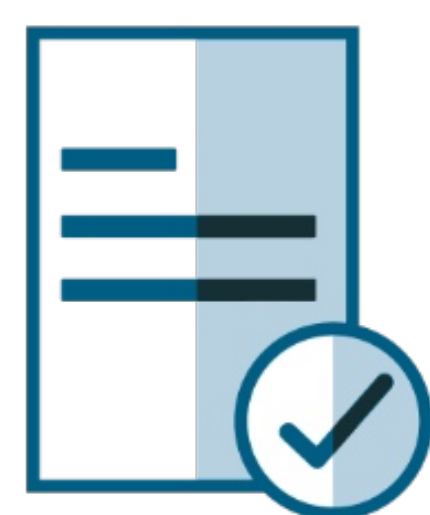

Confirm insurance coverage

- The specialty pharmacy will contact your insurance plan to confirm your coverage for VYNDAMAX. They will check on co-payment amounts and other financial assistance options

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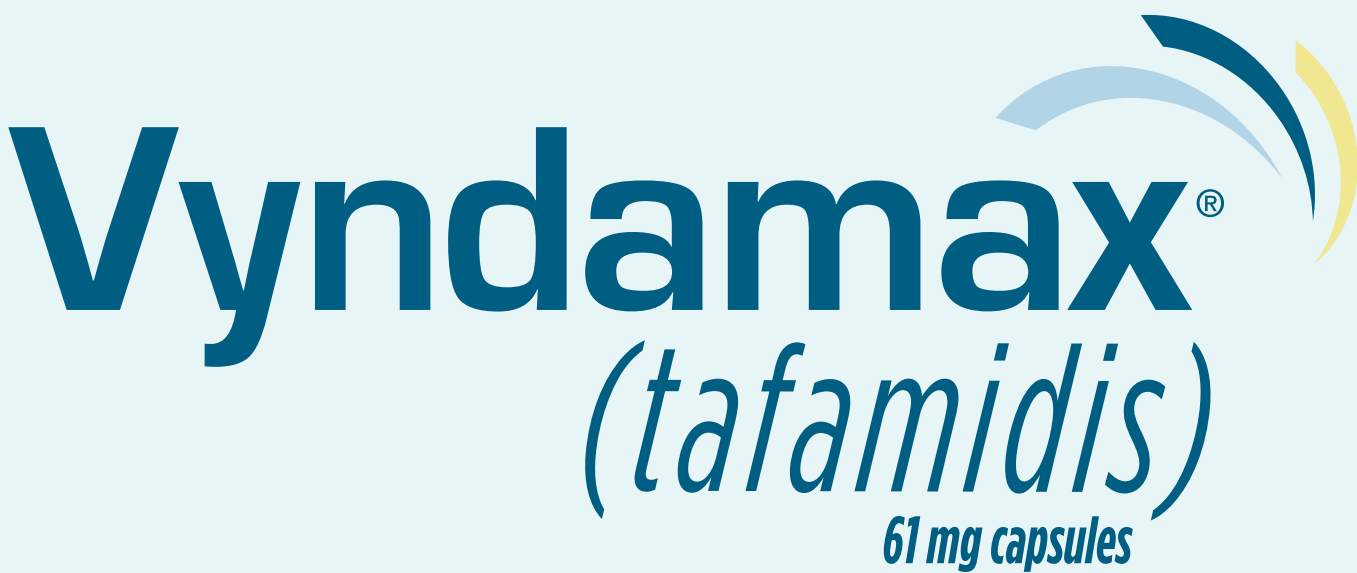
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Need support along your medication access journey?

- keep you informed with timely updates and actionable requirements

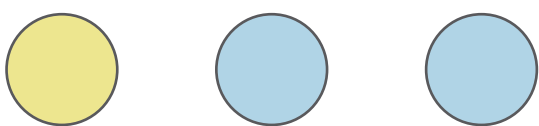

What is VYNDAMAX?

Before taking VYNDAMAX, tell your healthcare provider about all your medical conditions, including if you:

- have liver problems.
- are pregnant or plan to become pregnant.
- are breastfeeding or plan to breastfeed.

Tell your healthcare provider about all the medicines you take including any prescription or over-the-counter medicines, vitamins, and herbal supplements.

There were no known side effects that happened during treatment with VYNDAMAX.

2026 Medicare Part D changes

After you fill your first VYNDAMAX prescription in 2026, you will reach the \$2,100 out-of-pocket maximum.

\$2,100 is the annual out-of-pocket (OOP) cap for your covered Part D medicines. Once you meet this cap, you'll pay \$0 for all of your covered prescription medicines for the rest of the calendar year.



The Medicare Prescription Payment Plan** allows you the option to spread the costs of your medicines over a calendar year. The program is voluntary, and you can opt in during the plan year.

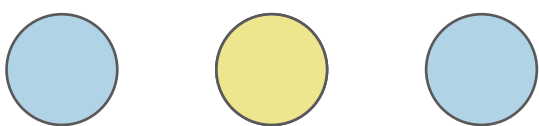

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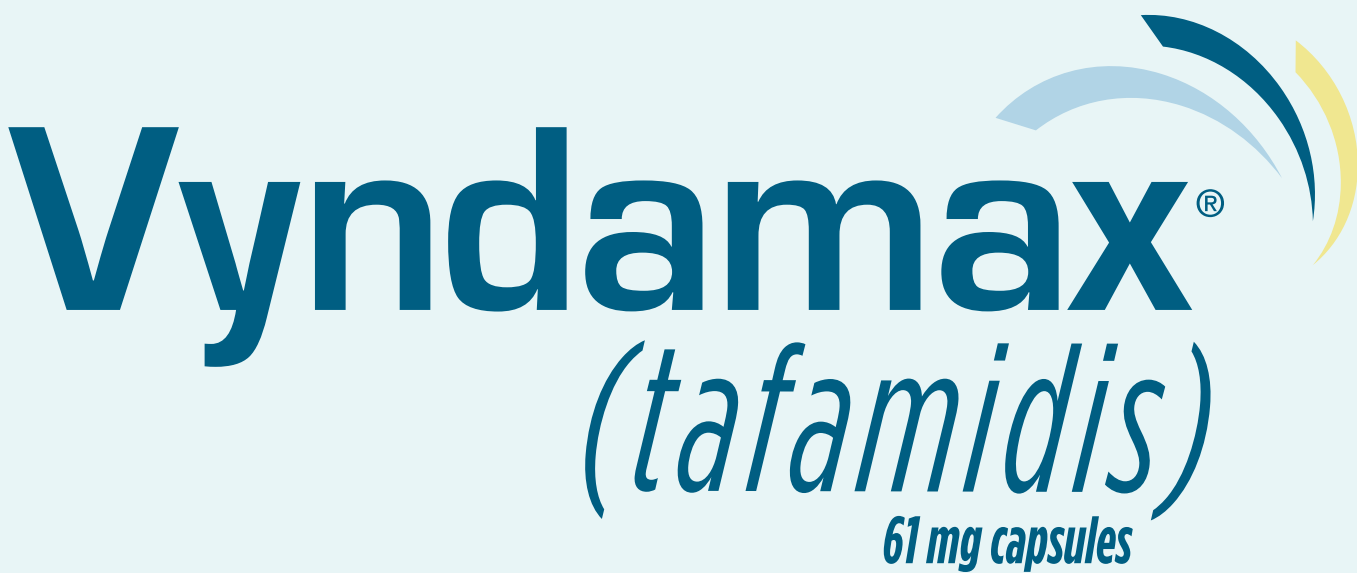
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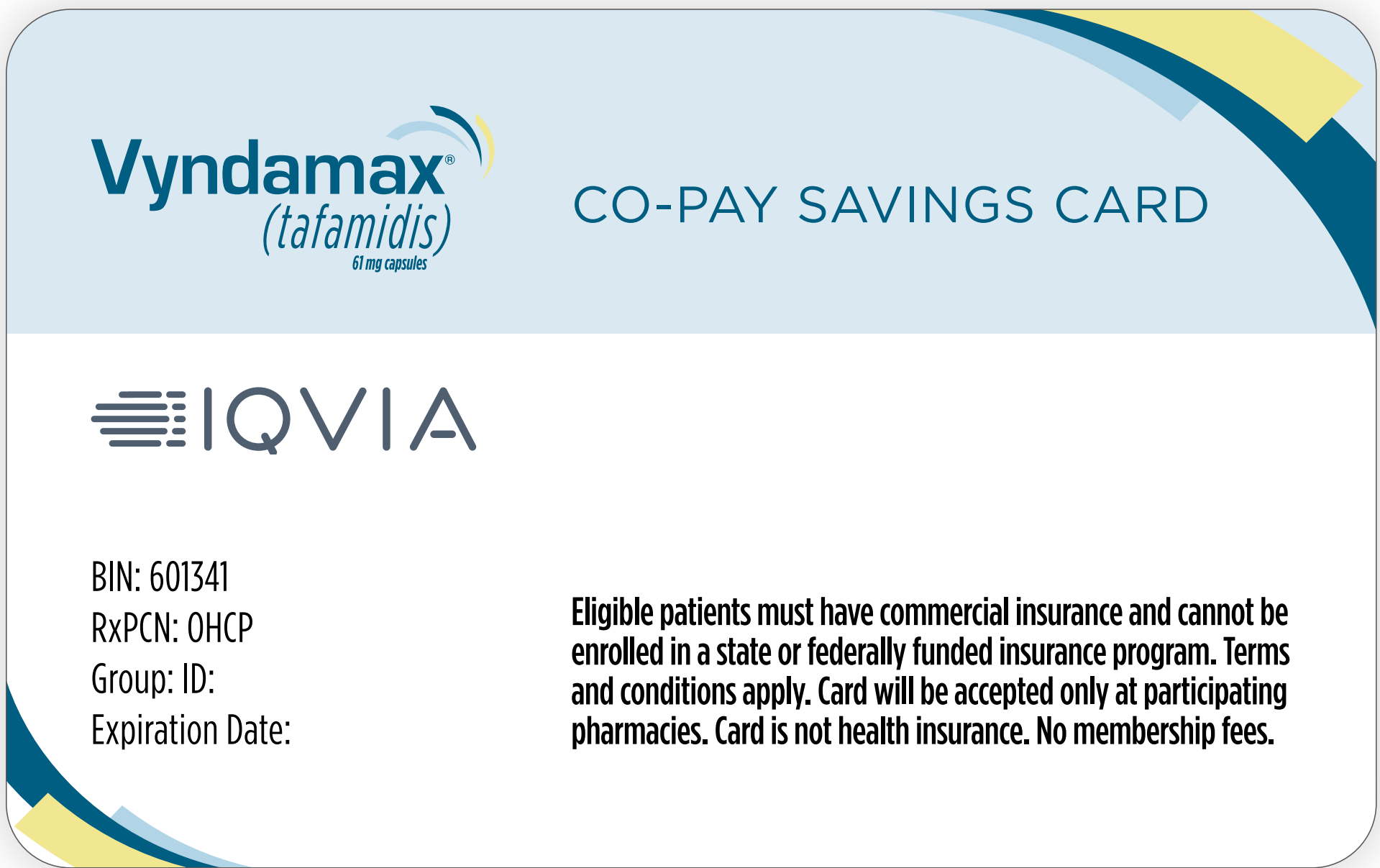
Co-pay Savings Program available for eligible patients with commercial insurance

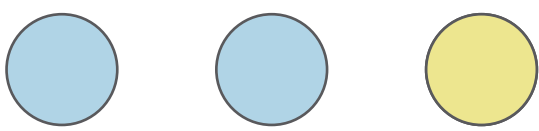

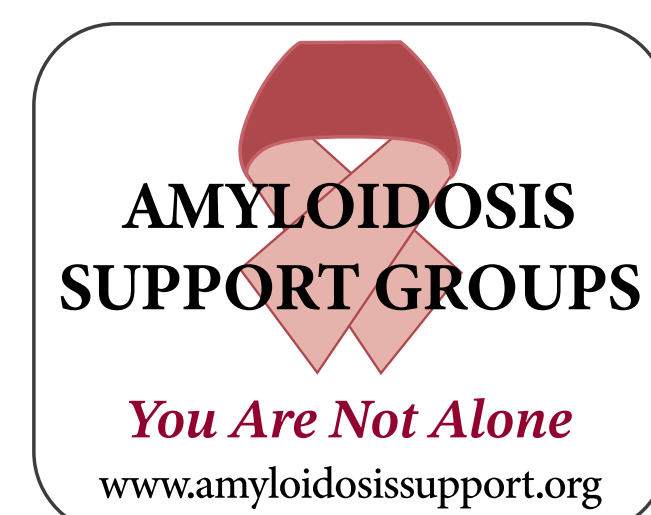
