Open enrollment for Medicare Part D is October 15 to December 7*





Open enrollment is when you can change your **Medicare drug plan**. If you switch plans, be sure to give your doctor a copy of your new prescription insurance card.



What you should know

- Most insurance plans will approve your medicine if your doctor requests special permission—called a **Prior Authorization** or **Medical Exception**—even if your plan says it's not covered
- If your current authorization has expired or if you're new to VYNDAMAX, your doctor will need to request insurance approval and send a prescription to a **Specialty Pharmacy**



What to do now

- You don't have to navigate this on your own
- Contact your Pfizer Patient Access Coordinator (PAC) to learn how to get your medicine, whether you're continuing VYNDAMAX in the new year or starting VYNDAMAX for the first time
